JESUS OUR GREAT HIGH PRIEST; THE HOLY SPIRIT OUR COMFORTER Week 15 - Addendum/JROC – What is Jesus DOING NOW? May 5, 2024

<u>Jesus INTERCEEDS for us</u>!!! Why is that crucial? Satan is accusing us day and night. Jesus <u>continually</u> intercedes – and so we read

<u>Phil. 1:6</u> - *being confident of this very thing, that He who has begun a good work in you will complete it until the day of Jesus Christ* (when He returns).

<u>Rom. 8:30</u> – Our salvation is secure because ... *whom He predestined* (foreordained; appoint beforehand; decreeing from eternity), *these He also called; whom He called, these He also justified; and whom He justified, these He also glorified.*

<u>I Pet. 1:3-5</u> - Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His abundant mercy has begotten us again (produced us; born again) to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, ⁴ to an inheritance (we are fellow heirs with Jesus [Rom. 8:17]) incorruptible and undefiled and that does not fade away, reserved in heaven for you, ⁵ who are kept by the power of God through faith for salvation ready to be revealed in the last time. BUT WAIT!!!! I am saved! What is this "salvation ready to be revealed in the last time"?

Three theological terms that explain our <u>complete</u> salvation: Justification sanctification glorification.

"Once saved always saved" – explains our ETERNAL SECURITY – we are saved for all eternity.

"Once saved COMPLETELY saved" - ?

<u>Heb. 7:25</u> - *Therefore He is also able to save to the <u>uttermost</u> (completely; forever) <i>those who come to God through Him,* <u>*since*</u> *He always lives to make intercession for them.*

JUSTIFICATION - declared righteous by God!

<u>John 1:12-13</u> - But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name: ¹³ who were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God.

<u>SANCTIFICATION</u> - we are *sanctified* as we grow in holiness through the work of the Spirit (Eph. 4:11–32 – gifts for the equipping of the saints for the work of the ministry; <u>Gal. 5:16–24</u> – walking in the Spirit) – conformed more and more to the image of His Son (<u>Rom. 8:29</u>). <u>GLORIFICATION</u> – we will be glorified when we are resurrected into eternal life. <u>Col. 3:4</u> – *When Christ who is our life appears, then you also will appear with Him in glory*. <u>I Pet. 1:5</u> – *we are kept by the power of God through faith for salvation ready to be revealed in the last time*.

These three words are used to describe the Christian journey from new birth to resurrection. Justification is a one-time event, sanctification is a process, and glorification is a future event.
